

Ratification of the Kigali Amendment will support the South Carolina Economy

Industries based on fluorocarbons play a large role in the U.S. economy. The technologies used by these industries across the globe are signature American innovations. Fluorocarbon-based manufacturing industries in the U.S. directly employ 589,000 Americans, with an industry-wide payroll of more than \$39 billion per year.

The Kigali Amendment will create 33,000 American jobs in less than 10 years, and will generate \$3.0 billion in additional labor income. These jobs and investment are in jeopardy if the U.S. government fails to act.

We must maintain American leadership in fluorocarbon product manufacturing.
